Theresa Frey, PharmD, BCPP is a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in mental health and substance use disorders (SUD) at the Madison VA. She graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Pharmacy in 2009. After her PGY1 Pharmacy Practice residency at the Madison VA, she completed a PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy residency and joined the pharmacy team in August 2011. Her clinical work includes residential substance use disorders, inpatient psychiatry, and outpatient psychiatric medication management. Currently she works on the SUD team. Her interest areas include resident/student mentoring, substance use disorders, overdose prevention, and motivational interviewing.
